SUMMER CAMP 2007

CAMPERS SAVED AT CAMP (PRAISE ITEM)

- There were thirty-seven professions of faith during the six weeks of Camp Horizon youth camps.
- There were 48 staff-campers at training camp and 448 regular campers for the six youth camps (496 total).
- There were 44 cabins of campers over the summer,
- Every child in the cabin made a profession of faith in 27 of these cabins.
- At least one child was saved at camp in 21 of the 27 remaining cabins.

HEALTH AND SAFETY (PRAISE ITEM)

- There were only two trips to the ER for stitches (1 Camper and 1 Staff), neither serious.
